Cards and Games

The Nipomo Newcomers Social Club currently has a number of card and table game groups who meet in the Black Lake Community Room or in the homes of their activity participants.

Bridge is a trick-taking card game using a standard 52-card deck. In its basic format it is played by four players in two competing partnerships, with partners sitting opposite each other around a table.

Bunco is played in two to four sets, with six rounds in each set. A player at the head table rings a bell to signal the beginning and end of each round. During the **game**, players at each table take turns rolling three dice to try and earn points.

Hand and Foot is a North American **game** related to Canasta, in which each player is dealt two sets of cards - the **Hand**, which is played first, and the **Foot**, which is played when the **hand** has been used up. There are numerous variations of this **game** and no standard rules.

Mexican Train is a **game** played with **dominoes**. The object of the **game** is for a player to play all the **dominoes** from his or her hand onto one or more chains, or "**trains**", emanating from a central hub or "station".

Mahjong is a tile-based game that was developed in China during the Qing dynasty and has spread throughout the world since the early 20th century. It is commonly played by four players.
