<u>From Pat Veronese</u>: if you like to make pies and prefer not making your own crust, the best pie crust to be had can be found at Trader Joe's.



From Helen Lewis whose cookies at the Picnic this year were popular: "Overnight Egg-White Cookies"

Beat together 2 egg whites and 2/3 cup sugar until very stiff. Add 1 cup of your favorite flavor item such as toffee chips (which was the ingredient used for the picnic), mini-chocolate chips, M&Ms, etc. Drop the batter by teaspoons onto a foil-lined baking sheet. Place in an oven pre-heated to 350 degrees and turn off the heat. Leave in the oven overnight (don't open the door to peek). Makes about 4 dozen.
